#### **Balcony Cleaning**

The clocks will be changing next weekend when we move back from British Summer Time. As in previous years, we recommend that residents carry out the regular cleaning of their balconies over this weekend (25/26 October) so we all know to expect some water! If it is not possible for you to do this over that weekend, please alert any neighbours below you before starting on an alternative date.

Under the lease agreement, you will be aware that responsibility for <u>cleaning</u> the balconies **remains with the resident**. This is a relatively easy task providing it is carried out regularly, but it can result in dirty water splashing onto lower balconies.

The cleaning regime is very simple and as follows:

- a. Sweep with a stiff brush to loosen any algae and accumulated dirt
- b. Collect and dispose
- c. Clean with a weak solution of water and mild detergent and a stiff brush
- d. Alert Encore to any loose screws or damaged boards (this is very important)

### Please do not use any chemicals or a power jet.

This week saw the welcome return of our Film Club, which last convened in 2023. Thirteen Riversiders met at The Burleigh Arms to consider a new format for the club and to review the Papal drama, *Conclave*, and several more indicated they will be joining future sessions.

Film Club will meet on the first and third Wednesdays of the month—the next meetings, therefore, will be the 5<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> November. Here's the agreed format.

- **6:15 pm Zoom meetup**: everyone joins a short Zoom call to say hello, catch up and hear a brief introduction to the film from the person who chose it.
- **6:30 pm Watch the film**: members watch the chosen film individually or in small groups. The films we select will use a widely available platform (e.g., Netflix, Amazon Prime, YouTube, BBC iPlayer, etc.).
- **Post-film discussion**: after the film, we meet in person—usually at the Burleigh Arms or another nearby venue—for drinks and discussion.
- **Special screenings**: occasionally, we'll choose a film showing at a Cambridge cinema (e.g., the Arts Picturehouse) and hold our discussion afterward at the bar there or nearby.

Tony Brown has kindly offered to chair the Film Club. He will be put together a members list and WhatsApp group, so <u>email</u> to let him know if you want to join (if you haven't already!). At each meeting, Tony will assign the next film choice to a member.

For Wednesday, 5<sup>th</sup> November, the film (chosen by Mark) is "Something's Gotta Give", starring Jack Nicholson, the late Diane Keaton, Keanu Reeves and Frances McDormand.
